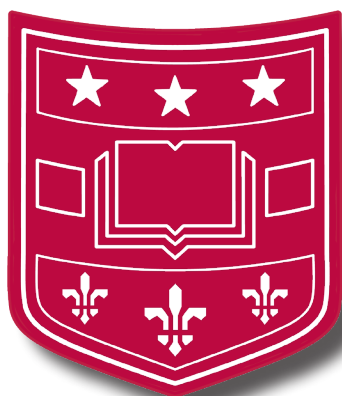

Greg Hewett is a senior advisor to businesses and institutional investors, working across industries. Greg also served as a Senior Managing Director (Partner) of The Blackstone Group, L.P., where he led a multidisciplinary team responsible for complex transactions on behalf of Blackstone funds/businesses and third-party clients. Prior to joining Blackstone, Greg served as an investment banker at Credit Suisse First Boston and at Donaldson Lufkin & Jenrette, and practiced law at the international law firm Bryan Cave LLP.

Greg serves on the Board of Directors, and audit and compensation committees, of Acushnet Holdings Corp. (NYSE: GOLF), the global leader in the design, development, manufacture and distribution of performance-driven golf products, and steward of the Titleist and FootJoy brands. He also serves on the Board of Directors of Nice Holdings, the parent of Evertrak, which is the leading developer, manufacturer and distributor of composite railroad ties composed of recycled plastic and glass. Greg also serves on the Board of Advisors of Washington University in St. Louis School of Law, and on the Board of Trustees of The Carver Project.
